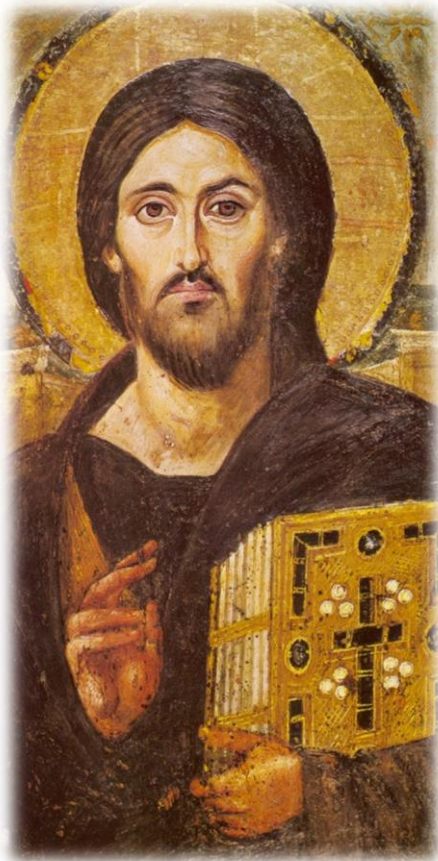




“The History and Theology of the New Testament Canon”

Lectures are designed for theology students as well as pastors and area missionaries. The seminar presents the history of the canon as the key to reclaiming patristic theology for evangelicals.

Jonathan J. Armstrong is a graduate of Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in the Chicago area (M.A., 2001) and Fordham University in New York (Ph.D., 2006). He has served as a postdoctoral researcher at the Friedrich-Alexander-Universität Erlangen-Nürnberg in Germany and has lectured at Wycliffe Hall as a full member of the theology faculty of the University of Oxford. Jonathan’s passion is to serve the church by providing seminars for pastors and laypeople throughout the global evangelical community.
